

**REGULAR MEETING
HUNTINGTON UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT
BOARD OF EDUCATION
August 7, 2006**

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Huntington Union Free School District was held on Monday, August 7, 2006, at Huntington Intermediate School, Lowndes Avenue, Huntington Station, NY 11746. Mr. Lee called the meeting to order at 5:30 PM.

ROLL CALL

COMMUNICATIONS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mr. Finello reported that he met with Town of Huntington Supervisor Frank Petrone; Bruce Richards; Drew Fiorello, S.C.P.D. School Resource Officer; Al White and Laurie Nolan, Deputy Supervisor and Debbie Walsh, with regard to the pathway between the high school and the condominiums on Horizon Drive. The Horizon Drive Civic Association wants a resolution to the issue of vandalism. The town will install a new fence and the school district will install a new gate on the high school side.

Mr. McGrath inquired as to whether the district would be interested in a windmill to generate electricity used by the district. Mr. Wisbauer, Thomas Associates, responded by making suggestions of other ways to conserve energy.

Mrs. Black visited the BOCES summer school being held at Stimson in the South Huntington School District. She is concerned about the grading policy for Huntington students and that there is no base line grade at high school.

PUBLIC COMMENTARY

Several parents are concerned about the curriculum at the primary schools. They don't feel it is challenging the students.

A resident inquired about the asbestos removal at high school, hiring a college counselor, hiring Director of Science, bond issue and upgrading computers. He also wanted to know if the bond issue is on the tax bills yet.

A parent asked about replacing the Dean at Huntington Intermediate.

A parent spoke about the overcrowding at Woodhull.

ITEMS OF FOR DISCUSSION AND ACTION

High School Track/Field Project

Mr. Wisbauer, Thomas Associates, said that the State Education Department approved the opening of bids. Bids will be opened on Monday August 14, 2006. Mr. Wisbauer gave the schedule of dates when each of the projects would be completed in 2006 and 2007. He also reviewed the SED regulations regarding new bleachers and bathroom facilities. Extensive discussion followed. A Board of Education special meeting will be held on Friday, August 18, 2006 at 8:00 a.m. for the purpose of awarding the bids.

Woodhull Classroom Additions

Mr. Wisbauer said it would cost approximately \$800,000 to build two classrooms at Woodhull and may also need to add toilet facility. Extensive discussion followed.

Elementary Facilities and Class Size Committee

Mr. Giani reported that the Committee is recommending not to move any students from Woodhull because it feels it is getting late and there will be similar additional space challenges in 2007-08 that will require Board action.
